

University of Iowa Hawkeye Poll – Topline Results

Poll of Iowa Respondents

SAMPLE: 1038 participants, margin of error for full sample is +/- 3 percent. Among these respondents, 32.55 percent were Democrat, 26.72 percent Republican and 34.55 percent Independent. 46.49 percent considered themselves moderate, while 20.92 percent self-identified as liberal and 30.9 percent as conservative.

ABOUT: The Hawkeye Poll was conducted November 10-17, 2013 by the Hawkeye Poll. The poll was conducted by the Hawkeye Poll Cooperative, comprised of UI faculty, graduate, and undergraduate students in political science, with the cooperation and facilities of the Iowa Social Science Research Center, directed by UI Sociology Professor Kevin Leicht. The faculty adviser for the poll is UI Professor of Political Science Frederick J. Boehmke. The poll is a teaching, research and service project of the UI Department of Political Science. The College of Liberal Arts and Sciences and the Office of the Provost fund the poll.

The firearm permit questions were written with University of Iowa undergraduate students as part of a class assignment on survey research.

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RESPONDENT IDENTIFICATION: A random sample was acquired with 70% household landline numbers and 30% mobile phone numbers. For households, an initial attempt was made on answering the phone to reach the youngest male who is 18 years or older. All who stated they were over age 18 and willing to participate in the survey were included.

WEIGHTING: Reported results are weighted by population and age.

QUESTION WORDING: In 2011, Iowa state gun permit laws were changed to allow legally or completely blind people to carry firearms in public. Are in favor or opposed to this change?
